

Lesson 1: Hemispheres and the Equator



WALT

K- I know what the equator and the hemisphere are.

S- Locate the equator and the northern and southern hemispheres on a map. .

Stem Sentence

The equator is an imaginary line that divides the earth in half.

The part of the Earth north of the equator is called the Northern Hemisphere.


The part of the Earth south of the equator is called the Southern Hemisphere.

Key Vocabulary

Hemisphere	The two equal halves of the earth.
Equator	An imaginary line that divides the earth in half.

Lesson activity idea

Mark the hemispheres and equators on a map of the world.

Lesson 2: Longitude and Latitude



WALT

- K- To identify the position and significance of longitude and latitude.
- S- Use longitude and latitude to locate positions on a map.

Stem Sentence

Lines of latitude run around the globe, like imaginary hoops.
Lines of longitude go down the globe, from top to bottom, and divide it up, like segments of an orange

Key Vocabulary

Latitude	These imaginary lines run around the globe.
Longitude	These imaginary lines run down the globe from top to bottom.

Lesson activity idea

Solve a treasure map using coordinates given by lines of longitude and latitude,

Lesson 3: Polar regions



WALT

K- To identify the position and significance of the Arctic and Antarctic circle
S- to identify similarities and differences between the Arctic and Antarctic Circle.

Stem Sentence


The Arctic Circle is the most northerly of the circles of latitude.
The Antarctic is the most southerly of the circles of latitude.

Key Vocabulary

Arctic Circle	The most northerly of the circles of latitude.
Antarctic Circle	The most southerly of the circles of latitude.

Lesson activity idea

Information hunt to find facts then create a poster explaining the difference.

Lesson 4: The Tropics



WALT

K- To identify the position and significance of the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn.

S- Use maps and atlases to identify the position of the tropics of Cancer and Capricorn.

Stem Sentence

The tropic of Cancer is an imaginary line in the Northern Hemisphere.

The tropic of Capricorn is an imaginary line in the Southern Hemisphere.

Key Vocabulary

The tropic of Cancer	An imaginary line in the Northern Hemisphere. The furthest north you can with the sun still directly overhead.
The tropic of Capricorn	An imaginary line in the Southern Hemisphere. The furthest south you can with the sun still directly overhead.

Lesson activity idea

Find countries in each tropic using a map or atlas.
