We are moving some classes again this weekend as the roof build moves onto phase 4.

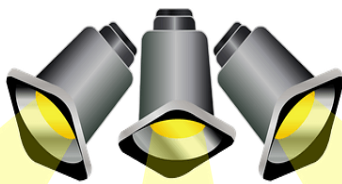
Year 4 will be moving back to their classroom which now has a lovely new roof.

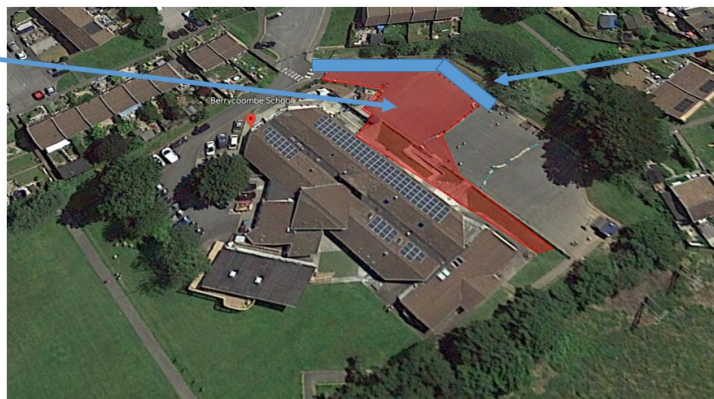

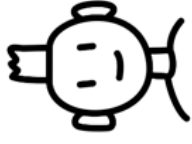
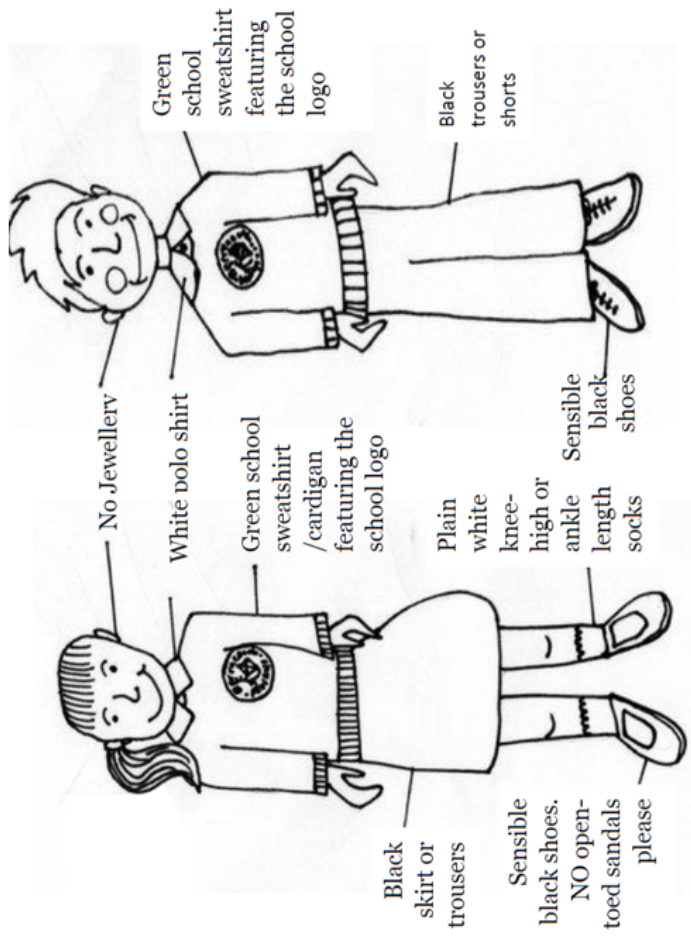
