Every week we also give a class prize for the class with the best attendance. To win everyone needs to come every day and be on time. Well done to all those children trying really hard with their attendance so far.



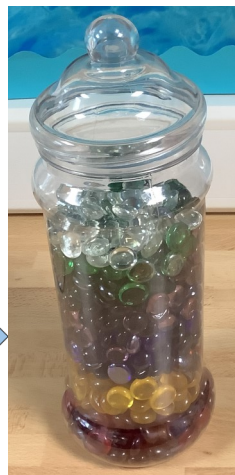
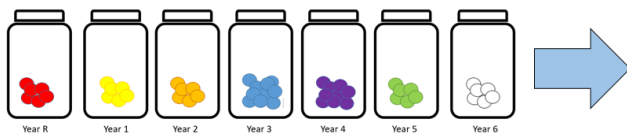
## Our value this half term is perseverance.

And please...

**Why?**
